The Hon. Zuraida Binti Kamaruddin is currently the Minister of Plantation Industries and Commodities (MPIC) of Malaysia, beginning in August 2021 under the new government led by Prime Minister Ismail Sabri. Already, she has made her intentions clear to align the agricommodities sector of Malaysia with the circular economy. This is her third time holding a Cabinet position in the Malaysian government. In May 2018, she was the first woman Minister of Housing and Local Government (MHLG) of Malaysia, a position she notably held through two successive governments.

As the minister of MHLG, she made her mark by reforming housing policies to improve living conditions such as enlarging government-subsidised homes from 700 to 900-square feet and transforming the rent-to-own (RTO) government schemes to make home ownership more accessible, especially for first-time buyers and B40 groups to middle-income earners. Under her leadership, the MHLG also made rapid improvements to the country's waste management policies, community credit facilities (money lenders) and increased the number of women in the local councils and the fire department.

Zuraida's assertive voice has been a fixture of Malaysian politics for almost two decades. She is a vocal and prominent champion of women's empowerment, and stateless children, being staunchly opposed to underage marriage, domestic violence, sexual harassment and gender discrimination. She played a major role in exposing the 'Rape of the Penan Women', by courageously championing the rights of the indigenous Penan women in the state of Sarawak who were being sexually exploited and threatened by illegal loggers.

In 2018, Zuraida was appointed as the Women Political Leaders (WPL) Country Ambassador to Malaysia. In continuing her life's work, she has pledged to mainstream gender parity and to increase the number of women's participation in all levels of decision-making in Malaysia to at least 30 percent.

Where the environment is concerned, Zuraida seeks to successfully balance economic growth with environmental protection. She believes that through education and awareness programmes, and especially through instilling good habits in the younger generation,

communities would be able to care for their immediate surroundings and inculcate good habits such as moving the society away from the culture of consumption, reducing waste, reusing and recycling resources and products.

Zuraida was born on 14 March 1958 and received her early education at the Girl's School in Tanjong Katong before pursuing her high school education at the prestigious Raffles Institution in Singapore. As a champion debater and country representative for international softball competitions until 1983, Zuraida has the passion and drive few can match up to. Prior to entering politics, she was working in the customer research, marketing, advertising and insurance industry in Malaysia and overseas. This stint in the corporate world in multinational companies based in Australia, USA, Japan and Taiwan, laid the foundation for her career in politics.

 - Propose to use cabins as new accommodations for plantation employees and ensure that it complies with Act 446 of the Ministry of Human Resources.

KEY CONTRIBUTIONS AS A MINISTER OF HOUSING AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT

• Formation of the National Housing Corp (NHC) (2021)

- NHC was created to coordinate three housing agencies under the Ministry of Housing and Local Government (MHLG), namely the 1Malaysia People's Housing Programme (PR1MA), the National Housing Department and Syarikat Perumahan Negara Bhd (SPNB) under a single entity.
- The NHC's focus is to carry out research and strategic planning, look into acts and legislation, control, licensing and enforcement of housing regulations to safeguard the interests of all parties involved in the housing industry such as the buyers, developers, contractors and financiers.
- The NHC also manages housing incentives, rental schemes, housing financing, maintenance and management of unsold units, in addition to coordinating and planning the construction, and preparing financial plans for affordable housing throughout the country.

Formulated the Urban Community Farming Policy (2021)

- A Malaysian federal government policy approved by the Cabinet aimed at regulating and propelling urban farming in Malaysia.
- The policy outlines five thrusts as well as 17 strategies that are in line with procedures and regulations enforced by local government authorities.
- This policy is an initiative targeted at empowering urban communities, while creating opportunities for communities and individuals to manage the short-term social economy by promoting organic vegetable farming.

• Formulated the National Community Policy (2019)

- A Malaysian federal government policy approved by the Cabinet with 8 primary clusters designed to create a more inclusive, harmonious and sustainable community.
- Served as the basis of all future actions and programs by the Ministry of Housing and Local Government.

Formulated the National Cleanliness Policy (2019)

• A Malaysian federal government policy approved by the Cabinet with 5 primary clusters designed to shift the mindset and practices of the Malaysian

community and industries towards a more sustainable and environmentally friendly waste management with an emphasis on the circular economy.

• Formulated the National Affordable Housing Policy (2019)

• A Malaysian federal government policy approved by the Cabinet with 5 primary components designed to ensure that housing remains affordable for ordinary Malaysians, particularly those who are low-income earners.
